Responsibilities	Screening and Feedback Use a dedicated platform to screen all shipment parties (e.g., shippers, consignees). Review and analyze flagged results and assess if they are valid based on regulatory requirements Share feedback with teams and document decisions on flagged shipments
	Compliance and Risk Ensure that all flagged shipments are resolved in compliance with international and domestic trade regulations Escalate serious cases to the Compliance Manager or Legal advisor for further investigation Stay updated on changes to restricted/denied party lists and embargo regulations
	Operational Coordination — Work with internal teams to collect shipment details — Contact clients or partners to clarify or confirm flagged information
	 Reporting and Documentation Keep clear records of screenings and resolutions using the platform. Create reports and highlight potential risks or recurring issues Help improve workflows and procedures
