Job Purpose	The Flight Safety Officer supports the Safety Manager in maintaining and continuously improving the Safety Management System (SMS) of the Air Operator Certificate (AOC) in accordance with EASA Regulation (EU) No. 965/2012 (Air OPS) and associated AMC/GM. The position ensures proactive identification of operational hazards, monitoring of flight safety trends, and coordination of safety risk management and assurance activities across all flight operations. The role is key in promoting a positive safety culture and ensuring compliance with the company's Integrated Management System.
Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Support the Safety Manager in the implementation, maintenance, and continuous improvement of the Safety Management System (SMS). • Support flight data monitoring (FDM) analysis and assist in identifying safety trends, operational exceedances, and areas of concern. • Support the Management of Change (MoC) process for operational and technical changes affecting flight safety. • Participate in occurrence reporting, investigation, and root-cause analysis, ensuring timely follow-up and closure of corrective and preventive actions. • Develop and maintain safety risk assessments (e.g., Bow-Tie or hazard analysis) and ensure compliance with EASA and IOSA standards. • Assist in the development of Safety Performance Indicators (SPIs) and monitoring of alert levels for flight operations. • Coordinate with Flight Operations, Ground Operations, Maintenance & Engineering, and CAMO to evaluate risk controls and operational interfaces. • Prepare and deliver safety briefings, reports, and trend analyses to management and operational departments. • Contribute to the Safety Review Board (SRB) and Safety Action Group (SAG) meetings. • Support safety promotion and training initiatives across all operational areas to strengthen the organization's safety culture.
