Job Purpose	<p>The Digital Cargo Compliance (DCC) Officer ensures our compliance with the World Customs Organization (WCO) regulations, instructions & security requirements, by utilizing artificial intelligence tools and various internal dedicated tools, for analyzing and screening flight data.</p> <p>The DCC Officer performs risk assessments on all cargo shipments, providing feedback and ensuring safe & secure cargo operations in compliance with international laws, rules, and regulations.</p> <p>This position monitors all cargo operations, bridges between operational & commercial planning teams, ensuring continuity of operations, resolving real-time issues and providing updated instructions in view of the regulatory requirements.</p>
Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Screening and Feedback <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Use a dedicated platform to screen all shipment parties (e.g., shippers, consignees, cargo description). – Review and analyze flagged results and assess if they are valid based on regulatory requirements and internal instructions – Share feedback with teams and document decisions • Compliance and Risk <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Ensure that all flagged shipments are resolved in compliance with international and domestic trade regulations & requirements – Escalate serious cases (e.g, Denied Cargo) to the Compliance Manager or Legal advisor for further investigation and further actions to follow – Stay updated on changes to restricted/denied party lists, embargo regulations, and updated internal workflows • Operational Coordination <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Work with internal operational and commercial teams to collect data and resolve irregularities. – Contact clients/relevant parties to receive information and clarify or confirm risk flagged information
